In keeping with our mission, the focus at this time of the year turns to helping others and furthering our relationships with our fellow engineers, members of the armed services and the society that we serve. The Kentuckiana Post has been involved in many good works throughout the past year and has plans for many more to come.

The November meeting agenda was filled with opportunities to promote our mission and several members were commended for their efforts. During the November meeting, a check for \$1,000 was presented to Dr. Joe Hagerty of the University of Louisville to purchase study materials for students preparing for the Fundamentals of Engineering Exam. The October meeting of the Kentuckiana Post of SAME was held Tuesday, 17 October 2006 in the Cafeteria Meeting Room at the Mazzoli Federal Building. Thirty-five (35) members and guests were in attendance. Post President Stephen Bickel made a few opening remarks and welcomed everyone. Clay Kelly led the Pledge of Allegiance and invocation which was followed by introductions of guests and members.

President Bickel then called on various officers and committee chairs to address the business of the day. The following items were noted.

- ◆ President Bickel reported on the Regional Conference held in Cincinnati 10 – 12 October 2006. Many KP-SAME members were in attendance along with two U of L students sponsored by the Post. The Post was well represented and he thanked those who were able to attend.
- ◆ Janet Skees, Small Business Co-Chair reported that save the date flyers went out to KP-SAME sustaining members and small local small business for the Small Business Workshop being held at the Holiday Inn on Broadway, 12 December. - ◆ President Bickel reported that KP-SAME will be supporting the deployed 19th Engineer Battalion by purchasing telephone cards to support them and their efforts. These phone cards will be included in holiday packages being sent to the Battalion. Volunteers are needed to help prepare the baskets. Contact President Bickel for more information.
- ◆ President Bickel encouraged sustaining member firms to let the Post know if their company has published articles in the Military Engineer magazine or the SAME News in the past year. This is a streamer requirement for the Post. He also asked if anyone had articles that could be submitted by the end of the year.
- ◆ Clay Kelly noted that Michael Earle was scheduled to speak about his experience at the Construction Camp but he rescheduled for the November meeting.

President Bickel then turned the meeting over to Education and Training Co-Chairman Rob Campbell who introduced the Guest Speaker Mr. Brian Bingham, Regulatory Management Services Director for Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD), who presented on Louisville's Wet Weather Consent Decree with the Kentucky Division of Water (KDOW) and the USEPA. Mr. Bingham briefly went over some of the agreements within the consent decree and the requirements MSD must abide by to comply with the Clean Water Act and avoid further fines and penalties. Mr. Bingham also went over what has been completed to date and the other major items that must be completed in the near future. In total MSD must spend \$800 Million on various projects to comply with the consent decree. While the consent decree is a very large and important effort, Mr. Bingham explained that it is not MSD's only focus.

President Bickel thanked Mr. Bingham for being a guest speaker and presented him with a token of appreciation. The next KP-SAME meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, 14 November.

minutes. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as circulated. *Motion passed.*

- ◆ The Treasurer, John Allison reported that \$4,389.46 was available in the treasury as of 17 October 2006 and there was one outstanding bill for \$99. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. *Motion passed.*



Committee Reports

- ◆ Clay Kelly reported for the Scholarship Committee and noted that the 2007 Scholarship Application will be released at the November regular membership meeting. Clay mentioned that he may be stepping down as committee co-chair if asked to fill the VP role for the Post. He noted several people who have expressed interest and will be in contact with them regarding the position.
- ◆ Tony Marconi reported for the Education and Mentoring Fund Committee. The FY06 Fund Report was complete pending the Leadership PE grant request needing approval from the Board. Tony presented grant applications from Leadership PE and the University of Louisville Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering as examples of the new application. He also asked the Board to approve distributions from the Education and Mentoring Fund of \$3,000 to Leadership PE for the 2006-07 class and \$1,000 to the U of L Civil Engineering Department for the purchase of FE review materials. A motion was made and seconded to approve the \$3,000 and \$1,000 distributions from the Education and Mentoring Fund. *Motion passed.*
- ◆ Frank Terak reported for the Readiness Committee. The Fast-Start Plan has been finalized. President Bickel commended Frank on his work with the plan and congratulated Frank on receiving a RVP Medal at the Regional Conference in Cincinnati.
- ◆ Janet Skees reported for the Small Business Committee. Janet announced that invitations and save the date reminders had been sent for the Small Business Workshop to be held on 12 December at the Holiday Inn Downtown. The agenda for the workshop is to have a "How to do business with USACE" session in the morning, SAME general membership meeting during lunch, and an exhibit hall with the large businesses in the afternoon. The costs are as follows: exhibitors \$150, small businesses \$50 for entire workshop, \$20 for SAME members attending lunch and afternoon exhibit hall. Attendees will be encouraged to bring a toy to donate to the Toys for Tots program and all proceeds beyond expenses will go to support deployed forces with the phone cards. Also, it was decided to also ask for donations to this effort on the registration form beyond the listed registration fees.

- ◆ Stephen Bickel reported that two members from the Student Chapter attended the SAME Regional Conference in Cincinnati and the experience was rewarding for both the students and the KP-SAME members who interacted with them at the conference. The students will be submitting articles about their experience for the Kentuckiana Post newsletter.
- ◆ Troy Mays reported for the Website Committee. Troy noted that the Young Members section of the website was in need of updating. The Small Business Workshop flyers have been posted on the website and once the Education and Mentoring Fund Grant Application is complete it can be posted as well. Troy asked the Board to send any other updates to him.
- ◆ Stephen Bickel reported for the Newsletter Committee. Stephen noted that the newsletter was distributed today and should be in everyone's inbox when they return to work.
- ◆ Kristen Crumpton reported for the Membership Committee. Kristen noted that the Post has 127 individual members with 12 new members added in August and September. That number is up from 93 reported at the last meeting. Kristen also noted that 23 individual sustaining members had been lost due to some sustaining firm memberships lapsing. Kristen is in the process of tracking down those firms.
- ◆ Gerard Edlen reported for the Programs Committee. Gerard noted that the next general membership meeting would be held on Tuesday, 14 November and the topic would be Force Protection. The speaker has not yet been determined.

New Business

- ◆ President Bickel asked the streamer leaders to give an update on their streamer applications. Stephen noted that the Governor Scholars info needs to be submitted for streamers. Also one streamer hole is submitting articles to the Military Engineer and SAME News. Stephen asked that if anyone has an article to submit or knows of an article submitted by their firm to please let him know.
- ◆ Marilyn Lewis reported that she needed information on the Habitat for Humanity Project that was done in connection with the ASCE young members. It was also noted that the Portland Promise Center still needed volunteers and that the project was a good candidate for matching streamer requirements.
- ◆ Stephen Bickel brought up the support of deployed forces streamer requirement and the Post's desire to help the 19th Engineering Battalion by purchasing long distance phone cards for the deployed Battalion. The cards would cost approximately \$20 each and there are nearly 400 troops

During the month of October, U of L's student chapter of the ASCE/SAME put together resumes, participated in mock interviews, and met potential employers. The Younger Member's Group of the Louisville Branch of ASCE as well as other engineers gave mock interviews along with pointers and advice on how to have a better interview. Students were then given a chance to hone their skills as they met future employers at a networking event hosted by the civil and environmental engineering department.

The chapter also volunteered on Saturday, 4 November for Project Warm. The effort included five student teams that went around to homes in Louisville and provided weatherproofing for windows and other small tasks. Each team was given rolls of plastic sheeting, tape, scissors, and various materials, so that heating costs could be reduced for families in need.

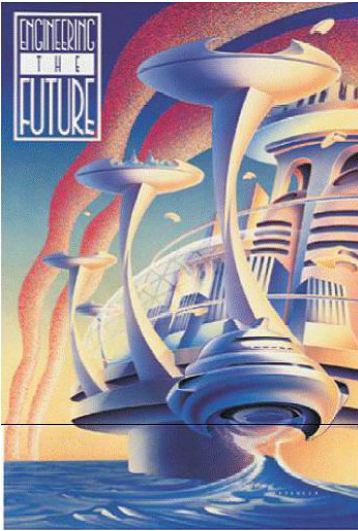

ENGINEERING PROBLEM . . .

A backhoe weighing 8 tons is on top of a flatbed trailer and heading east on Interstate 70 near Hays, Kansas. The extended shovel arm is made of hardened refined steel and the approaching overpass is made of commercial-grade concrete, reinforced with 3/4-inch steel rebar spaced at 6-inch intervals in a criss-cross pattern layered at 1-foot vertical spacing.

Solve:
When the shovel arm hits the overpass, how fast do you have to be going to slice the bridge in half? (Assume no effect for headwind and no braking by the driver...)

Extra Credit:
Solve for the time and distance required for the entire rig to come to a complete stop after hitting the overpass at the speed calculated above.

Only a limited number of abstracts will be selected for presentations, so it will be a competitive process. We are looking for topics of high interest to the uniformed engineering services and high quality speakers. The five tracks are:

- **Contingency Engineering, Emergency Preparedness and Response** - Includes lessons learned from Katrina, Iraq, Afghanistan; infrastructure security
- **Installation Development and Realignment** – Includes BRAC, master planning, Global Re-stationing, MILCON transformation, enhanced use leasing
- **Installation Management** – Includes Joint Basing, asset management, energy management, sustainability
- **Professional Development** – Includes licensure and professional certifications, ethics, leadership
- **Developing Military Leaders** – Includes mentoring by senior officers, professional military reading, Joint Task Force lessons learned

Proposed Transition Workshop and Job Fair

The concept is to have Sustaining Member companies sponsor the event and have suites that can be used to interview and meet the talented individuals that will be entering the job market in 2007. COL Ed Gibson, USA (Ret), 21 Delta Search, is assisting with the planning of the workshop. The tentative agenda is as follows:

- ◆ **Friday, 26 January:** Start at 1:00 p.m. with panels of officers, NCOs and civilians who have recently transitioned out of government and representatives from environmental, engineering, construction and facility management organizations who can describe the types of positions available in the A/E/C industry and facility management, followed by time for attendees to visit with Sustaining Member Companies in their suites. The evening is free for companies to invite prospects to informal dinners.
- ◆ **Saturday, 27 January:** Start at 7:30 a.m. with networking time, following by presentations on resumes, interviewing and compensation and benefits, followed by lunch and time for attendees to meet with Sustaining Member Companies. For those attendees who do not desire to attend these sessions, Sustaining Member company suites will be open all morning for employment discussions. The session will end at 2:00 p.m.

To be successful, we will need interest from Sustaining Member Companies so that we can attract the talented people in government that will be entering the private sector market in 2007.
