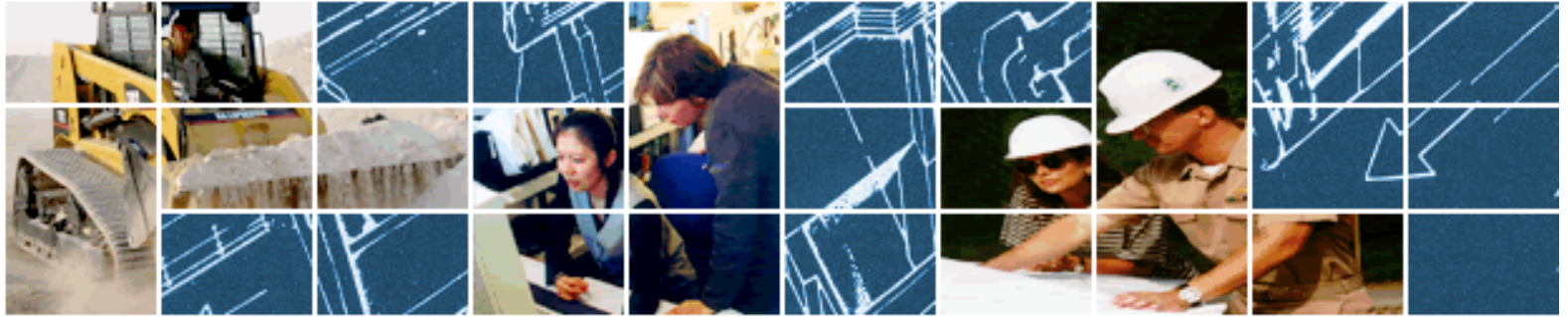

Department of Justice

- Department of Justice
 - GAO MCS & International Program Group
 - GAO Decisions not binding on the Executive Branch
 - SBA regulations regarding the relationship among the 8(a), HUBZone, and SDV Programs constitute a permissible construction of the Act.
 - On new requirement the contracting officer determines which set-aside program to use: SDV, HUBZone, or 8(a)
 - Parity.
 - Recurring requirements that are 8(a) remain 8(a).
 - No more 8(a) search letters
 - Small Business Set-Aside if not two or more in 8(a), HUBZone, or SDV.



Small Business Set-aside

-
- 2,500 - \$100,000 is automatically reserved exclusively for SB concerns and shall be set aside for SB
 - \$100,000 set-aside for SB participation when
 - (1) offers will be obtained from at least two responsible SB concerns,
 - (2) award will be made at fair market prices
 - SB Competitiveness Demonstration Program
 - Can not set-aside certain requirements
 - Construction/A & E
 - Still required-- 8(a), HUBZone, and SDV
 - Mandatory SBSA does not apply to Federal Supply Schedule Buys

Under the Small Business Competitiveness Demonstration Program, small business set-asides are suspended for certain Designated Industry Groups (DIGs). However, pursuant to reference (a) sections III. D. 2.a. and IV. A.3, participating agencies such as the Department of Defense (DoD) are required to reinstitute the use of small business set-asides whenever contract awards to small business, under any DIG, fall below a 40 percent participation performance rate. Reinstitution of small business set-asides is limited to the organizational unit(s) within the participating agency that failed to meet the small business participation goal(s). Accordingly, this Memorandum supersedes reference (b) to reflect the results of the annual review of DoD's small business participation data for Fiscal Year 2007.

The Federal Procurement Data System – Next Generation indicates that for the 12-month period ending September 30, 2007, DoD's small business participation rate was less than 40 percent in the following DIGs:

1. Construction, Subsector 236, Construction of Buildings
2. Non-Nuclear Ship Repair, Product or Service Code J999 (West Coast only)
3. Architect and Engineering Services, (including Surveying and Mapping)
4. Refuse Systems and Related Services

DOD and AF, 2008-1017, 4 Nov 08**

**This case concerns the constitutionality of 10 U.S.C. § 2323
("Section 1207")**

- (1) sets a "goal" that five percent of federal defense contracting dollars to be awarded to certain entities including small business concerns owned and controlled by "socially and economically disadvantaged individuals";
 - (2) incorporates the Small Business Act's presumption that Black Americans, Asian Americans, Hispanic Americans, and Native Americans are socially disadvantaged individuals;
 - (3) provides that the Department of Defense shall give specified forms of assistance to the listed entities and may, when practicable and necessary to achieve the five percent goal, make advance payments to those entities and award contracts to them at prices up to ten percent above fair market cost.

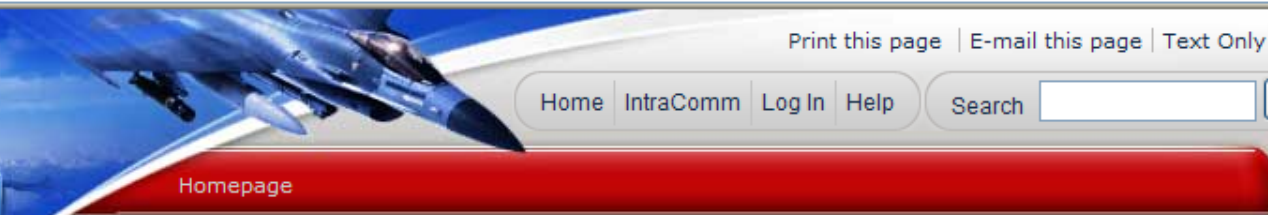
Section 1207 (i.e., 10 U.S.C. § 2323) is unconstitutional on its face

- “Because we will hold that Congress did not have a “strong basis in evidence” before it in 2006, upon which to conclude that DOD was a passive participant in racial discrimination in relevant markets across the country and that therefore race-conscious remedial measures were necessary, we will reverse the district court’s judgment in part, and will hold that Section 1207 (i.e., 10 U.S.C. § 2323) is unconstitutional on its face.”
 - Awaiting for DOD/AF to make a decision on appeal or new policy.
 - Likely impact on SDB, 8(a), HBCU/MI Programs
